- 4. Dual Language Program Update, Jennifer Hamilton
 - a. Jennifer Hamilton as lead for Dual Language program across the district; she oversees staff who coordinate to program schools
 - b. Change to dual language program at MVCS, starting in SY 23
 - c. Changes to support overall student needs + better alignment with ACPS dual language program model
 - i. Ex: middle grades program, dual language program features social studies content in Spanish - this doesn't match up with subject areas taught at younger grades and can make for a more challenging transition for students wanting to stay in dual language program
 - d. Current model
 - i. John Adams 70/30 (English/Spanish) in K, 1st grades; then transitions to 50/50 for upper elementary grades
 - ii. MVCS 50/50 across all elementary grades
 - e. Beginning in SY 23, phased approach to shifting MVCS to match with John Adams program
 - i. Starting in SY23: Kinders shift to 70/30 model (Spanish/English)
 - ii. Starting in SY24: 70/30 model (Spanish/English) follows into first grade
 - f. For older elementary grades, phased approach for 3rd and 5th graders
 - i. Starting in SY23: 5th grade social studies content in Spanish, science content in English
 - ii. Starting in SY24: 3rd grade social studies content in Spanish, science content in English
 - g. Rationale for changes
 - i. Improve long term literacy outcomes for all participating students
 - ii. Improve Spanish proficiency for all participating students
 - iii. Better alignment between elementary and middle grades
 - iv. Better alignment between instruction language for high stakes testing mandated by VDOE (SOL)
 - v. Research based practice, based on bi literacy models

 - i. Staffing: What about teachers who are mono lingual?
 - 1. MVCS leadership evaluating how to make changes in staffing plan so that those teachers who aren't proficient in Spanish can teach in other grade levels/subjects/focus areas to best match program needs and staff expertise.
 - ii. Are there anticipated changes to program options for dual language at the high school level
 - 1. Currently AP Language track
 - 2. Dual credit options
 - a. Looking to grow from there, including additional core content and career/technical education
 - iii. What is the anticipated impact for MVCS kids who may only experience one year of program changes?

- Seeing some benefits already with current sixth graders who had similar changes from the John Adams program; results look promising
- iv. Will there be an impact to other content time because of changes to the schedule?
 - Trying to keep things as balanced as possible; one benefit will be that teachers won't have to spend as much time prior to testing windows helping kids transfer knowledge from Spanish to English in core tested areas (ex: science)
