

WHAT WE DO


Over the last 36 years, thanks to the generosity of the local community. DURING COVID

Local students 8, families who have been hardest hit by COVID and its economic impacts are the very same families we serve. **Our mission and our work has never been more critical than right now.**








LICE:

- Tiny, parasitic insects that feed on tiny amounts of blood from the scalp
- They are very common in kids between 3-11 years old.
- They are not considered a "health risk" and are not a reason for students to be excluded from school.







THEY CANNOT JUMP OR FLY, BUT THEY SPREAD EASILY AMONG CHILDREN

They survive on soft surfaces for less than 24 hours

WHAT CAN WE DO?

CHECK YOUR CHILD WEEKLY FOR LICE

-By the time lice are easily visible, they have likely been present for 4-6 weeks.

-Comb and inspect regularly

SCREENINGS? NOTIFICATIONS?

Both the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) and the CDC advocate for the following practices to be **discontinued**:

- whole classroom screening,
- exclusion for nits or live lice,
- notification to others except for parents/guardians of students with head lice infestations (Devore et al., 2015; CDC, 2015b, para. 3).
